## Terms and Conditions of Sales Facility

As a condition to using the Direct Registration services provided by Computershare Trust Company, N.A. ("Computershare"), you hereby agree to the following terms:

### 1. Sale Requests.

- (a) As a holder of book-entry shares, you may request that Computershare sell all or a portion of your shares in writing (via your *Common Stock Transfer Request Form*), online at [www.computershare.com/metlife](http://www.computershare.com/metlife) or via telephone. In submitting the sale instruction, you agree that Computershare may transfer your shares to complete the sale, including transfers to a nominee account of Computershare and to Computershare's brokerage firm.
  - (b) If available, market order sale requests received at [www.computershare.com/metlife](http://www.computershare.com/metlife) through the Investor Center or by telephone will be placed promptly upon receipt during market hours (normally 9:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Eastern Time). Any orders received after 4:00 p.m. Eastern Time will be placed promptly on the next day the market is open. The price shall be the market price of the sale obtained by Computershare's broker, net of fees.
  - (c) Batch order sale requests received in writing (including via your *Common Stock Transfer Request Form*), by telephone or at [www.computershare.com/metlife](http://www.computershare.com/metlife) through Investor Center by Computershare will be processed no later than five Business Days after the date on which the order is received assuming the relevant markets are open and sufficient market liquidity exists (and except where deferral is required under applicable federal or state laws or regulations). (As used herein, the term "Business Day" means any day except a Saturday, Sunday, Federal Reserve Bank holiday or New York Stock Exchange holiday). All sale requests received in writing will be submitted as batch order sales. In every batch order sale, the price to each selling shareholder shall be the weighted average sale price obtained by Computershare's broker net of fees for each batch order placed by Computershare and executed by the broker. To maximize cost savings for batch order sale requests, Computershare will seek to sell shares in round lot transactions. 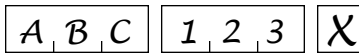
